

ST JAMES PRIORY

Brief Description

The Priory of St James was founded as a cell of the Benedictine Abbey of Tewkesbury by Robert, First Earl of Gloucester in the 12th Century. The site comprises of the Grade I listed church, dating from 1129, and Church House, listed grade II*, dating from 1666.

In addition to providing a place of worship the site is home to the St James Priory Project, a charitable Trust providing a well respected initiative that offers support and treatment, on the abstinence model, targeting homeless people in particular.
